

TEXTURED WICKER TREES

Simple Techniques - Stunning Effects





# **MATERIALS**

MB1581 Small Wicker Tree
MB1582 Medium Wicker Tree
Fan Brush
Medium Brush
Sponge

# **COLORS**

CMM 73 - Honeycomb CMM 72 - Sahara CMM 82 - Olive You CMM 67 - Snowflake



### INSTRUCTIONS

### Larger Tree:

- 1. Apply one generous coat of Olive You all over the main section of the tree, making sure to get paint into all the crevices. Allow the paint to dry.
- 2. Use a damp sponge to wipe off the excess paint. We want to leave the paint in the crevices and remove the paint from the raised area.
- 3. Apply one generous coat of Honeycomb to the braided section using a medium brush. Allow the paint to dry.
- 4. Use a damp sponge to wipe off the excess paint from the braids. We want to leave the paint in the crevices and remove the paint from the raised area. Do not rinse the sponge.
- 5. Take the dirty sponge and wipe around the base section and the tip of the tree to leave a little bit of color.

#### Smaller Tree:

- 1. Mix up equal parts of Snowflake and Olive You to get a lighter shade of green.
- 2. Apply one generous coat of that color all over the main section of the tree, making sure to get paint into all the crevices. Allow the paint to dry.
- 3. Use a damp sponge to wipe off the excess paint. We want to leave the paint in the crevices and remove the paint from the raised area.
- 4. Apply one generous coat of Sahara to the braided section using a medium brush. Allow the paint to dry.
- 5. Use a damp sponge to wipe off the excess paint from the braids. We want to leave the paint in the crevices and remove the paint from the raised area. Do not rinse the sponge.
- 6. Take the dirty sponge and wipe around the base section and the tip of the tree to leave a little bit of color.

#### **TIPS**

- Rinse out the sponge frequently as you're wiping the mug to keep the raised areas clean.
- Any colors can be used for this technique.
