

FINGERPRINT POPCORN BOWLS

Simple Techniques - Stunning Effects





MATERIALS

CCX999 Round Rice Bowl
Liner Brush
Medium Brush
Fan Brush
School Auction Popcorn Pottery
Silkscreen
Goo Powders
Small Container for Mixing Goo
Screen Squeegee
Writing Bottle

COLORS

CMM 13 – Cinnamon Stick
CMM 90 – Red Hot
CMM 19 – Banana Boat



INSTRUCTIONS

If you don't already have it on hand, you'll need to mix up "goo" to apply the silkscreen. For this piece, you'll need Cinnamon Stick goo.

- Add 2-3 Tablespoons of underglaze to your container.
- Add a hefty pinch of Goo Powders and stir to combine.
- Let the mixture sit for 5 minutes and stir again. If it looks like pudding it's ready to use. If it's too thick add more underglaze. If it's too thin add another pinch of Goo Powders and stir.
- Start by using the Cinnamon Stick goo to apply the popcorn to the outside of the bowl. Apply as many individual pieces of popcorn as desired rinsing out the screen as needed.
- 2. For the fingerprints:
- Brush on a heavy amount of Banana Boat to the finger and press onto one of the individual pieces of popcorn.
- Use a pencil to write the child's name next to the print.
- 3. Use a fan brush to apply 3 generous coats of Red Hot to the inside of the bowl.
- 4. To apply the names, use a detail writing bottle with Red Hot to write the name net to the popcorn containing that child's fingerprint.
- 5. If desired, write the class/organization name on the bottom of the bowl with the year.

TIPS

- Applying 3 generous coats to the red will give you a solid color.
- If you're going to use this for fingerprints, make sure you apply at least as many individual popcorn pieces as you have people.
- For the writing bottle, only fill the bottle 1/2 way to avoid it coming out too fast. This will help with smaller writing.
- Get the writer bottle flowing on a paper towel before you write on your piece. This will work out any air and sputtering that might occur.
