

TECHNIQUE: ZEBRA PAINT

Simple Techniques - Stunning Effects



## **MATERIALS**

DB37473 Honeycomb Salad
Plate
Sheet of Paper
Fan Brush
Clean Water
Straight Pin

## **COLORS**

CMM 14 - Gum Drop CMM 2 - Stonewash



## INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Start by painting your piece with 2–3 coats of Stonewash. This will be the color of your stripes.
- 2. Allow the color to dry while you move on to step 3.
- 3. Tear up your paper in strips, making sure to remove any of the straight edges from the paper.
- 4. Lay your strips out on the piece before you stick them on to plan out your pattern.
- 5. Working one at a time, dip the strips in clean water and place them down on your piece.
- 6. Paint a thin layer of your Stonewash over the strips to ensure they're firmly on the piece.
- 7. Use your fan brush and paint 2–3 coats of Gum Drop all over the piece, covering the paper. This is going to be the background color behind the stripes.
- 8. Allow the piece to dry until the color starts to lose it's shine. Peel off the strips to reveal the design.
- 9. To remove the strips, poke inside the edge of the paper with your pin and scoop it upward to release the paper.

## **TIPS**

- Contrast between the colors is important, so choose a light and a dark if you're changing colors.
- Make sure after you stick the stripes on that the first color gets brushed over the entire piece, sealing down the stripes.
- Don't wait until the paint is bone dry to remove the stripes, it works best if you remove them when the shine starts to fade.
